SAFETY RESOURCES for domestic violence survivors!

Inquire about safety in the home in your clinic's visit questionnaire: "Do you think your pets feel safe & secure at home?"

Ask specific questions if inadequate care or fearful interactions are observed: "Are there circumstances at home that prevent better grooming or that cause your pet to be fearful?"

Work with a local domestic violence service agency to train your staff on the recognition of potential violence in the home and appropriate steps to take - Check out thehotline.org

Provide resources and referrals to agencies that can help -

Use non-threatening communication such as discrete placement of brochures or posters in the restroom

Help all clients think about evacuation planning that includes pets - Natural disaster readiness can help spark ideas for other safety planning
